• The Crowne Plaza Suffern-Mahwah has completed a multimillion-dollar renovation designed to modernize and elevate the guest experience. The project included extensive upgrades to all 229 guest rooms, now featuring mini-fridges, Keurig coffee makers, 55-inch flatscreen TVs, upgraded bedding, and high-speed wireless internet.





Public areas also received a fresh new look, with the hotel's open-concept atrium redesigned for a brighter, more welcoming feel. The property's 25,000 square feet of flexible meeting and event space was updated to better accommodate gatherings of up to 600 guests. The Montebello Ballroom, a signature venue for weddings and corporate events, was fully reimagined in collaboration with Karen Dallago of Dallago Associates, blending modern elegance with functionality.

Outdoor spaces were enhanced including our scenic pergola for ceremonies and an inviting patio with fire pits, ideal for both private functions and casual evenings. Flagstones Restaurant now offers a refreshed dining environment alongside its daily breakfast buffet and omelet station, while Koi Lounge provides an updated setting for evening cocktails and dining.

The renovation reaffirms the Crowne Plaza Suffern-Mahwah's position as a premier destination in the Hudson Valley, combining contemporary amenities with versatile event options to meet the needs of both business and leisure travelers.



• Eastwick College received from the American Council on Education in collaboration with the Carnegie Institute, the "Carnegie Opportunity University" status! This recognition identifies the institutions that provide access to students from lower socioeconomic backgrounds along with the degree to which the institution's students go on to earn competitive wages. Only eight colleges in NJ were recognized! Eastwick was named along with Rutgers and NJIT. Quite an accomplishment!

Our sister institution, HoHoKus School of Trade was also honored with a "School of Excellence" award by the Accrediting Commission of Career Colleges and Schools. The School of Excellence Award is the highest institutional distinction awarded by the ACCSC. It celebrates accredited member institutions for their steadfast adherence to ACCSC's rigorous accreditation standards and outstanding record of student accomplishment.

Eastwick Foundation has provided more than \$1,000,000 to local charities over the years and I'm especially proud of our "Feed the Hungry" program. In 2025 we are closing in on donating over \$500,000 to Bergen, Passaic and Rockland food banks. Our foundation is the hard work of our students, grads, employees and local corporations. • The New Jersey State Botanical Garden at Skylands is proud to mark its 40th anniversary in 2025, commemorating the designation of Skylands as the official botanical garden of the Garden State by Governor Thomas Kean on September 15, 1985.

For four decades, **NJBG** has served as a living collection of more than 5,000 plant species, a historic site of two former botanical estates, and a beloved public resource for environmental education and enjoyment.

To celebrate this milestone, NJBG will host public festivities at the Botanical Garden on Sunday, September 14, 2025, welcoming visitors to enjoy the grounds, tours, and other anniversary activities. A formal rededication ceremony will take place on Monday, September 15, and is by invitation only.






